Take stock of what's important to you

Your home is probably filled with a combination of necessities and life's little luxuries. Think of how difficult it would be to remember each and every item you own if you experienced a theft. Taking a written inventory of your possessions can help ensure you won't forget what you have when it really matters.

By identifying your valuables and putting together a record of all your property, not only will you deter thieves, you'll give ACT Policing a better chance of finding your property if it is stolen, and returning it to you.

Identifying your property

Thieves generally don't like stealing property that is clearly identified. Marked property is harder to dispose of.

Once you've completed the inventory on the other side of this brochure, be sure to store it in a safe place. Make a copy and leave it with a trusted friend.

A more comprehensive way of managing your household inventory is via the "**Mystuff**" program. It is a free, easy-to-use home security record management software system provided by ACT Policing to help you protect your property.

It allows you to create an accurate, concise, and permanent record of your personal property.

If you have access to the internet, log onto the AFP website at www.afp.gov.au and search for "Home Security Software".

Serial numbers help police track stolen property.


